REMEMBER – ONLY STANDARD CLASSES COUNT TOWARDS KC PROGRESSION

Classes will run in numerical order. A running order will be drawn in advance. Discretion will be given to allow those whose dogs are drawn close together to space their runs accordingly, but please keep to the drawn sequence. The Club intends to use electronic timing in all rings.

* LOWER HEIGHT OPTION:

1. All LARGE classes will offer the new Lower Height Option (LHO) and will have combined awards.
2. Once a dog has been entered at the LHO it cannot compete at a different height in any class at this competition.
3. Lower heights are set at 550mm (large dogs).
4. The Lower Height dogs will run FIRST in every class. If you are late turning up you will lose your run.
5. There will only be one course walking at the start of the class. Classes will run in numerical order. A running order will be drawn in advance. Discretion will be given to allow those whose dogs are drawn close together to space their runs accordingly, but please keep to the drawn sequence.

Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.

AWARDS

(To be collected on the day during prize giving).

Placing rosettes to 10% in all classes. Trophy to 1st place in each class. Clear round rosettes in all classes. President's trophy and Chairman's trophy will be awarded to the dogs and handlers who provide the most entertaining rounds (in the Judges' opinion).

(All those travelling from afar to our show please bring a rosette sized SAE if you cannot stay for prize giving so any prizes can be sent on. Those that win a trophy either stay and collect them or bring the necessary packaging stamps etc so they can also be sent on.)

Combined classes are open to more than one consecutive grades and there is one overall set of results for the whole class. Graded classes are open to one or more consecutive grades with separate awards for each grade.

In accordance with Kennel Club Rules, ALL dogs competing in small or medium height categories must be measured for competition. Competitors must ensure that their dog is measured prior to their first competition and that the dog's Agility Record Book has been signed and dated by the measuring officials.

Large dogs entered for competition will not require an official Kennel Club measurement. Once a dog has competed in any Class in the Large Height category at Kennel Club Licensed event it may not change to a different height

Lower Height Option. Societies may offer the Lower Height Option to all dogs in that height category and may be offered at all grades. It is to be run as part of any Standard class as defined in the regulations and must be clearly identified in the schedule. When the Lower Height Option is scheduled a dog may only be entered at either the Full Height or at the Lower Height and cannot compete at a different height in any class at that competition. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. Each relevant class will have two heights with a change part way through to higher/lower the jump heights and competitors must run at their entered height. The order in which the heights will run must be detailed on the ring cards/ring plan. There will be only one course walking at the start of the class. In a class where the Lower Height Option is available show organisers may offer one set of awards by combining the results of each height or may offer separate awards for each height category.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted).

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins in standard classes at that grade, except that progression from Grade 5 will require 3 wins at Grade 5, one of which must be an agility class. Progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers), except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade. Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 2 (Starters)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 3 (Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 3 first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an Agility (not Jumping) Class, and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Societies may schedule classes other than those defined above as "Special Classes".

The eligibility for "Special Classes" must be defined by the society and included in the schedule. The word "Special" must be included in the title of the class. Where special classes are classified for older and/or inexperienced dogs, the height of the hurdles and the A-ramp, and the length of the long jump, may be reduced below the dimensions specified in these regulations, in which case such dimensions must be included in the class definition in the show schedule.

Marking for special classes may deviate from marking for standard classes, but must be specified in the schedule. Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.

Special Anysize Jumping

Open to any dog not entered in any other class at this show. Jump heights; 250mm and 350mm - no weaves, long jump or tyre. Handler to decide what height the dog jumps.

Special Tunnel Fun

An open flowing jumping course consisting of jumps and tunnels, no tyre jump or weaves.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/ authority to compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. Entry fees: Non-members £6.75 per dog (entitles entry to 3 classes). Carn Brea Members £2.25 per dog (entitles entry to 3 classes). Anysize entry fee: Non-member £2.25 Carn Brea members £0.75. Entries without fees will not be accepted.
4. No Prize money will be awarded at this show.
5. No entries may be made via the Internet.

6. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
8. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
9. Organisers of Limited Agility shows may set a capping level on the entries to be accepted in any standard or special class, and may decline entries received after the capping level has been reached. State if specific classes are to be capped and the capping limit. The capping level must be set at a minimum of 250 entries received. There is no maximum level at which a cap may be set.
10. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
11. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
12. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
13. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden
14. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar ie. not attached by a ring.
15. Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
16. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
17. There is no sponsorship received at this show.
18. Kennel Club standard marking regulations apply for all standard classes.
19. The Special Anysize Jumping – the height of the jumps will be a maximum 350mm.
20. The height limit for dogs.
 - a. Large Dog classes - For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
 - b. Medium Dog classes - For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
 - c. Small Dog classes - For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
21. Judges in Standard Classes at a Limited Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge in a standard class at a limited show
22. Special classes may be limited by numbers or class entries, overall numbers of entries, specific breeds, residence of competitors, membership of societies or organisations or in any other manner at the discretion of the organisers which must be clearly stated on the schedule.
23. Dogs which have won an Agility Certificate or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Agility Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club are not eligible for entry in special classes at Limited Agility Shows or in Agility Matches.
24. **Withdrawal of dogs from Competition:**
A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Show if it is:-
 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
25. In estimating the number of awards won, **all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition** shall be counted when entering for any class. i.e. up to and including (**22nd June 2017**). For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, **it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show.** The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
26. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
27. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
28. No refunds will be given on incorrect entries. No entries will be refunded after the closing date rule 27 excepted.
29. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
30. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
31. Free Passes – All competitors will be provided with a free pass enabling them to enter the event at any time of the day their competition is scheduled, but in the case of a dog owned in partnership only one such pass will be issued. Parking passes are £2.00.
32. **Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease** – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
33. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
34. **Animals in Event** No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
35. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
36. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised

by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.

37. **Welfare of Dogs** An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

38. Except for mobility aids or silent toys, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring. Dog Agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the Owner/handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in Agility classes on the day of the show.

39. Competitors must follow the instructions of the Stewards with respect to parking and conduct within the show boundaries and any person directing abuse to Stewards or Officials will be asked to leave the venue immediately.

DOGS MUST BE KEPT UNDER CONTROL AT ALL TIMES
(Please note the word dog also means bitch)

CHILDREN UNDER 16:

The duty of care remains with the parent(s) or other accompanying responsible adult(s) at all times.

Your dog is **vulnerable** and **AT RISK** if left in a vehicle in
high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm

Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary
without liability for any damage caused.

PLEASE CLEAR UP after your dogs and place in the **black bags** provided by the ring

HEALTH AND SAFETY DECLARATION

Competitors and spectators are reminded that, just as Carn Brea Agility Club has a responsibility to ensure the health and safety of all those attending their event, competitors run at their own risk if conditions are not ideal and have a duty and responsibility for their own safety. Competitors are also reminded that they should wear appropriate clothing and footwear for the prevailing conditions on the site.

Health and Safety Policy Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974 the management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999.

General statement of policy:

The allocation of duties for safety matters and the particular arrangements that we will make to implement the policy are set out below.

The policy will be kept up to date, particularly if the Association's activities change in nature and size. To ensure this, the policy and the way in which it has operated will be monitored and reviewed every year or more frequently if required.

SAFETY INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE

All Exhibitors must comply with the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 and all relevant Regulations and Guidance, Animal exhibitors must also comply with the Animal Welfare Act 2006 and any relevant codes of practice, guidance, etc. provided by the relevant governing body organisations.

SHOW SECURITY

Limited security cover by the Association's official security contractor will be provided nightly between 7.00pm and 7.00am from Monday before the Show and then continuously from 2.00pm on the Sunday until 7 a.m. on the Tuesday after the Show. You must be aware that the Showground is large, with multiple entrances and that the security officials cannot be in all areas at all times. The Association will not be responsible for the safe custody of any article brought for exhibition, nor will they be answerable for any loss or damage that may occur to any article.

FIRE SAFETY

All catering outlets or trade stands must assess the risk of fire and provide for effective primary fire prevention equipment where any potential ignition sources are present.

GAS SAFETY

Any fixed installation gas equipment (cookers, pipe work, valves etc.) must comply with the provisions of the Gas Safety (Installation and Use) Regulations 1998 L56 (Fourth Edition) published 2013. All catering vans / marquees with gas installation MUST have a Gas Safety Certificate / Gas Safety Record.

Note: These certificates can ONLY be issued by an Engineer that is listed on the Gas Safe Register. A certificate MUST BE provided to the organisers prior to entry to the event. The regulation can be viewed on: <https://www.ncass.org.uk/mobile-catering-home/content>.

PORTABLE ELECTRICAL APPLIANCE SAFETY

HSG107-Third Addition 2013 INDG236-Rev 3 2013

The law requires electrical equipment to be maintained to prevent danger. The type and frequency of user checks, inspections and testing needed will depend on the equipment, the environment in which it is used and the results of previous checks.

All portable electrical equipment brought onto the showground must comply with:

HSG 107 - Third Edition 2013 Maintaining portable and transportable electrical equipment, or INDG236 - Third Edition 2013 Maintaining portable electrical equipment in offices and other low risk environments.

Diesel generators – the use of diesel generators is permitted provided modern, quiet equipment is used. Petrol generators are not permitted and the Association reserves the right to ask for what they regard as unsuitable equipment to be removed.

SHOWGROUND TRAFFIC

All showground traffic must give priority to pedestrians and riders and strictly observe speed restrictions at times when such movement is permitted.

During the Show (9am to 6pm) all showground roadways must be kept clear of any vehicles, exhibits, stands, canopies, etc. to allow free passage of emergency vehicles at any time.

Please note strictly no unauthorised movement of vehicles will be permitted within the show ground between the hours of 0800 and 1800 hours. N.B. Trade and Craft Stand Exhibitors are required to remain open until 18.00 and MUST NOT attempt to leave the Showground before that time due to the danger of interaction with pedestrians.

Livestock exhibitors: may leave the showground prior to 1800 hours, subject to the approval of the Showyard Directors and notification to the Section Secretary (movement is only to comply with DEFRA Animal Welfare regulations).

MAJOR INCIDENT PLANNING (SITE EVACUATION)

In the event of a major incident where it is necessary to evacuate the site, in accordance with the Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999, please follow all signs and instructions from the Organisers and Emergency Services.

ALL people will be requested to evacuate the site, until it is deemed safe to return. The Association accepts no responsibility for any property or livestock or any person or persons who fail to comply with the request to evacuate the showground.
